Year 5 and 6

Our new theme is Tudor Wales, over the topic please select at least one home learning task from each area of learning.

If you have a good idea that is not included on your list – please check with Miss Richards or Mrs Lewis to see if it can be included in your project.

Literacy Language and Communication	Write a play about a Tudor Banquet. Act it out at home, Film it or take photographs.	Find out how the Tudors spoke. Write down some of the words and practice talking like a Tudor.	Research Shakespeare's life. Create a biography – how you present this is up to you!	Make a poster or leaflet to persuade people to time travel back to Tudor times – why would they want to go? Be persuasive!
Mathematics and Numeracy	Find out how long each of the Tudor monarchs reigned for. Draw a graph to show your results.	King Henry VIII reigned for 38 years. He had 78,000 people executed while he was king. Calculate on average how many people were killed per day?	Find out about Tudor money and what they would buy with it. Make up your own word problem to ask the class.	Find or draw a picture of the Tudor Rose and draw the lines of symmetry on it.
Science and Technology	Find one invention from Tudor times, draw it, label it and write a paragraph about it.	Create a Tudor game on Scratch – think about how it fits the theme.	Use Google Classroom and create a collaborated slide show with a partner/ three. This could be on any area of Tudor life.	Find out what the Tudors did to cure illnesses. Make an information sheet.
Humanities	Create a quiz to test the class on their knowledge of Henry VIII's wives.	Make a map to show what countries were discovered and visited during Tudor times.	What would you do if you were KING OR QUEEN FOR THE DAY? Draw or write about your ideas.	Find some differences and similarities between the Catholic and Church of England religion. Record your findings in a table.
Expressive Arts	Find out about Tudor musical instruments. Draw and label some of them.	Make up your own Tudor dance. Film it, take photographs or prepare to teach us it at school!	Design and make a dress for Elizabeth I. Make sure you research Tudor fashion so that your dress is fit for a queen.	Draw a detailed picture of Hampton Court palace.
Health and Wellbeing	Research Tudor Football. Write a comparison between 'Tudor Football' and 'Modern Football'	Research jousting. Create a warning poster/leaflet about the dangers of the sport.	Investigate Henry VIII's diet. Think about the 'Eatwell Plate' write some advice for how he could be eating a healthier diet.	Research a Tudor sport or pastime game. Write instructions for how to play it.
